 - -28% (2004)
 - -5% (2005)
- International admissions
 - -18% (2004)
 - **+3% (2005)**
- International First Time Enrollment
 - -8% (2002) -10% (2003) -3% (2004)
 - **+1% (2005)**
- International Total Enrollment
 - +8% (2002) -1% (2003) -3% (2005)
